From the desk of Senior Pastor Joel Treick





This month, our church embraced the 1% Challenge. We're asking God to raise up and send out 1% of our church members into cross-cultural, foreign missions. It's a little bit scary, but we believe God can do this, and we believe that God would be glorified if our prayers are answered!

Right now, our prayers are attached to specific people. We're praying for Brenden, Ashley, Keira, and Oakley. They're talking to MTW right now and have a goal of reaching the mission field in a year. We're praying for Heather. She's a college student who's headed overseas for at least 11 months. (I'm not sure if I can talk about where she's going, but she's been assigned to a specific team. I had a video chat with her team leader last week, and that leader is awesome! Heather is already an amazing Christian person, so I can't wait to see what God is going to do in her life through this trip!)

We're praying for others who are still pretty early in the discernment stage. They're open to going and they're praying for direction, but they're not sure what God wants them to do. (We're praying for them by name too, but I'm not mentioning them by name because they're so early on in the process that I don't want add any extra pressure as they seek God's will. 99% of us are NOT called to foreign missions, so just the fact that they're willing to consider it is great!)

In case you were wondering, the people we want to send out are some of our best and brightest people. I'm asking God to send away our Children's Director, one of the best youth interns we've ever had, one of our brightest college students, and a fully-invested member of our worship team. (Full disclosure: I'm only *kind of praying* for the guy on the worship team. I use the famous Presbyterian caveat, "If it be your will," a lot more when I'm praying for him.)

The people I'm asking God to send away are people who are committed to worship, discipleship, prayer, and evangelism. They're friendly, kind, and generous. They're open with their struggles. They're approachable. They're committed to Jesus. They're committed to our congregation.

So why would we ask God to send them away? I've thought about that a lot lately.

FROM THE DESK OF OUR SR. PASTOR

Here's my answer: We're asking God to send them away *because* they're our best and brightest people! We're asking God to send them away *because* they love Jesus. We're asking God to send them away *because* they understand that the gospel is good news, and they want people to hear it! We're asking God to send them away because according to the Joshua Project there are more than **3 billion** lost people in the world, and 80% of those lost people don't know a single Christian person. We're sending them out because we are unapologetic believers in the Great Commission. We believe that God saves people through ordinary people who preach an extraordinary message – that Jesus died on the cross to save sinners like us. We're sending them out because the cross matters, because grace matters, because heaven and hell are real places, and because lost people matter to God.

So how are we going to do this? 1% is a big goal! 1% of our congregation is about 3 people. (Maybe closer to 2.5 people, but we're going to go ahead and round up to 3. It's only fair. Pastors, when someone asks you how big *your* church is, when was the last time you rounded *down*? That's what I thought.) Is that realistic? Nationwide, is it realistic to raise up **3742** missionaries?

A few weeks ago, I was talking to a new friend from MTW who asked me if I thought the **1% Challenge** was realistic or reasonable (two things we value very highly in the PCA) and my answer was, "No! Absolutely not! It's not realistic at all! It's completely unreasonable. Just think about what we're asking God to do. We're asking God to quadruple our foreign missions force! We're asking God to raise up and send out some of our best people! That's crazy! We'll be short-handed! We'll never be able to pay for this! Humanly-speaking, this makes no sense!"

"And that's why I love it."

I love the fact that we're asking God to do something so big, so audacious, so beyond our own capacities and capabilities that when it happens ... the only explanation is, "God did this!" I love the fact that I won't get the glory! I love the fact that MTW won't get the glory, I love the fact that the PCA won't get the glory ... I love the fact that God will get the glory!

What if we prayed, "God, would you please raise up and send out 1% of our members?" Do you think God can answer that prayer? (I think he can!) Wouldn't you like to tell your kids and grandkids about the time we had an unrealistic dream and prayed audacious prayers ... only to sit back and laugh as God answered those prayers *beyond* our wildest dreams? (I would!)

So here's my question: Will you join me? Will you join us? Will you pray? Will you believe the promises of God? Will you send your best and brightest people to the foreign mission field? Will you support them in their training and fundraising? Will you believe that God can use them to change the world by advancing the Kingdom of God?

That's what the 1% campaign is all about. That's why we're all-in. Are you?

Joel and Stephanie serve in a sensitive ministry.

Joel and Stephanie recently spent a week in the southern part of their country, participating in a Prayer Walk/Vision trip with others in Christian ministry. During this time they walked through the streets of a large city, spending time in intensive prayer for each section of that city. When they returned home from this week they were weary but happy, profoundly challenged in their own prayer ruts and inspired to go deeper, conscious that our loving Father is calling us to do just that, and that He is desirous of communicating his heart to us.

They are encouraging us all to deepen our prayer lives, and have asked us to pray for the following:

- **Spiritual protection and perseverance** in prayer: Pray for us and for each participant as we are challenged by how we apply back home what God has impressed on us.
- **Growth, renewal, and the Spirit's power** for the French churches we visited, most of whom are small and struggling.
- Walk with us: On Thursdays we walk and pray in our township. Please ask God to give us good questions, insight, wisdom, and boldness as we pray, so that out of that, He would show us what specifically is His heart for this town and our role in that.
- **Joy in prayer:** Believe it or not, in the past months it's been SO easy for us to walk our neighborhood praying and then think, "Wow, the day's half gone, and we've hardly gotten anything done," thus betraying our materialistic mind-set. Pray for God to increase our faith and change our hearts so we do ministry with the conviction that prayer *really does change* spiritual realities.



Now back home, we have a heightened appreciation for our intercessory role as we live in the heart of our township. From our balcony, we see everything that happens in the center of town: the bus stops, war memorial park and music school (above), Catholic church, commerces and little shopping center (left of picture), and town hall, concert hall, sports center, media center, library, schools, open-air market, and independent cinema (to the right of picture). We've even prayer-walked in the falling snow!

Ian and Heather serve in a sensitive ministry.

Ian reports that the ministry has been growing over the past few months. The very first class of night courses had 18 students! The first class was a survey of the Old Testament. The students loved the course. Below Ian shares a message he received from one of the students after the first course:

Hello Pastor Ian I am very happy to have met you. It is only now after 31 years of pastoring that I really begin to know the salvation I have in Jesus Christ! Thank you. I am thankful to God that He has led you to me. I praise my God for your life and your pastoral ministry. --- A B.

It has been a blessing for Ian to be able to see some of the impact that the courses are having on the students. However, since he is currently the only teacher it has been quite exhausting for Ian to teach intensive, one-week courses, back to back over a couple of months. Ian realizes that he must slow things down a bit until he can get some help. It has been decided to change the program and only do one night course a month so that Ian will have time to build the course and prepare. The next night course will be in May on the Doctrine of Scripture.

The day courses are going well also. A pastor from a neighboring country has been invited to come and teach on healthy ministry strategies. Ian will be teaching again in May on the Doctrine of Christ and in June and July on the Doctrine of Salvation.

The community health and evangelism program is also going well. The work on weaving is going to restart this week. One exiting development is the chief's wife has started teaching ladies from another village how to make soap, as she was taught to do last year. There will also be a big community soccer tournament outreach during the end of May.

Jon and Teresa Simons serve with SIM-USA. Jon teaches Seminario Biblico de Colombia in Medellin, Colombia. They currently reside in Melbourne, Australia, where Jon is attending graduate school and working on his dissertation.

In Teresa's own words, news of how they are settling in to their new home:

In many ways, I (Teresa) think this move has been the hardest one of all 7 times Jon and I have moved since we got married. This seems illogical, as we are settled in a wonderful little house with a lovely yard and are finding both a great number of warm, open churches and a great amount of ministerial need. Despite that, I am finding my heart torn as I yearn for the people, purpose, and, of course, the connections that we were foraging in Colombia. In the midst of all the busyness of homeschool and doctoral studies, it is hard to start over again with community and it is hard to not be in Medellín: the city that called us away from our home and family. That being said, remembering the seminary and students gives us new energy and new purpose as Jon begins to really dig into his research, I strive to continue to improve my Spanish, and the kids and I work to strengthen subjects that weakened over this past year.

Jon is already working on research for his dissertation and comes home every night with new ideas and insights to share from ancient philosophers and early theologians. It is exciting to have time to process these thoughts and to think about how they can be applied in the Colombian context. He is under a lot of pressure to work both quickly and with excellence and is generally spending long hours working. He is also commuting to work on his bicycle again, which provides him with some outdoor time. He really looks forward to his daily 34 km which take him through a lot of parklands with kangaroos and beautiful birds.

Teresa and the kids started homeschooling a few weeks ago and are enjoying getting to spend lots of quality time together after the past chaotic months. The kids fell behind in a lot of subjects over the past year, so it has been good to regroup and start remembering what it feels like to love to learn. Thanks to our precious Abuela (Jon's mom), who has agreed to teach them Spanish, we are hoping that the kids won't regress too much. We are also enjoying the perks of being in a country with a really different ecosystem and have already started identifying lots of exciting new birds and animals!

Praises:

- Praise! God provided a house, car, and furniture within our budget and beyond our expectations.
- Praise! Despite fears and rumors, we found a few Christian homeschool families here and are starting to get involved in a very diverse homeschool group.
- Praise! Australia is a beautiful place with lots of parks and trails and we are really enjoying time outside after a year of very limited outdoors.
- Prayer Requests:
- For a greater understanding of who God is that will inform and guide our thoughts, prayers, and actions
- For FUSBC, as another school year begins and the small (but gifted and resilient) team of staff and faculty work to strengthen both the university and the student body despite some serious physical infirmities and limited resources. Pray for strength, wisdom, and provision as well as for the growth and strengthening of the students.
- For God's wisdom and guidance as we begin to form relationships with new people: including both believers in different churches and a lot of unbelievers in our neighborhood and homeschool group
- For Jon's continued work with FUSBC in Colombia where he is **teaching** an online course now and more in the coming months and for our continued, long-distance relationships there
- For Jon's studies
- That God will guide us to the **church** that He wants us to join
- For a godly **community**

Our brigade is currently deployed to Iraq, in support of killing ISIS. I'm right now supporting our reardetachment, and slated to join our forward deployed personnel soon. PRAYER REQUESTS: Pray for us to rest in Christ, and improve at patiently waiting on His timing. Pray for my being present for my Soldiers and managing energy levels so that I don't become an empty well, as I seek to spiritually feed my flock! Deployment isn't easy, and I expect to be drained again come next summer when I redeploy home from the Middle East. Pray for our family: that Allyson would be able to survive as a "single" mom of four kids while I'm deployed. Pray that we'd have good communication while I'm gone, so that we'd encounter fewer relational issues once I return. I have spoken with several discouraged Soldiers lately who have been tempted to give up on their commitments and abandon their contractual obligations. These conversations are great because it allows me to drill down deep and talk about why it is that any of us do what we do. And how ultimately, when we serve the Lord with all our lives there is no such thing as a meaningless experience. My theme for the upcoming deployment will be "don't settle for anything less than God." PRAYER REQUESTS: Please pray for our transition into theater. 
The Missions Team humbly asks you to submit a support card to indicate your dedication to the Lord's work through our Pinewoods Missionaries.






Crime Scene Jerusalem






