Hey everybody!

I have a quick update this month as we head into what I hope will be an exciting and eventful summer!

As I write this, I'm getting ready to drive to Atlanta for our annual General Assembly. That's an annual meeting of the Presbyterian Church in America where we gather together to hear reports and render decisions about the various agencies and committees of our denomination. We'll hear reports about our denomination's camp (Ridge Haven), our denomination's campus ministry (Reformed University Fellowship), our denomination's North American ministries (Mission to North America has a prison ministry called *Metanoia*, a church planting ministry, a ministry aimed at reaching our Hispanic neighbors in the United States, etc.), and about our denomination's World Missions ministries. (We have hundreds of missionaries serving around the world right now, and are hoping God raises up 1% of our denomination for overseas, cross-cultural mission work!) Less exciting is the judicial aspect of the General Assembly, unless of course you're fascinated by the idiosyncrasies of Robert's Rules of Order, but that needs to be done. We always have a number of pressing theological, ecclesiological, and missiological issues to be discussed, and it's great to listen to perspectives from teaching and ruling elders from around the country and around the world.

As we head into the summer months, don't forget to be praying for our students as they head to RYM in Colorado. (RYM stands for "Reformed Youth Ministries." They do conferences throughout the summer months.) God often does amazing things in the hearts of young people as they get away from their normal routines at home and at school. God *also* does amazing things in the hearts of chaperones! So please be in prayer for these students and adult volunteers. A lot of silliness happens at RYM, but a lot of <u>seriousness</u> happens too. These students will be hearing from some of the best Bible teachers in the country. (That's not an exaggeration. The speakers are very good.) They will be challenged to make the Christian faith their own. They'll be challenged to take holiness seriously. They'll be challenged to find ways to glorify God and enjoy him <u>every day</u> as they connect more deeply to our local church. So, again, please pray for Samuel Armstrong, for our students, and for our volunteer leaders!

Another thing to be praying about is our annual *Faith and Arts* camp. Led by Brenden and Ashley Camp, we have a growing team of volunteers who will be teaching and encouraging the elementary school children of our church, and a growing number of elementary school children from our community who may have little to no connection to any church. If you can volunteer, we'll give you a t-shirt and put you to work! If you have elementary school children of your own, grandchildren, neighbors ... this is always a really fun week. And, like RYM, it's an opportunity for the children to learn about Jesus.

One last thing! If you're traveling this summer, would you let us know? You could talk to me, one of the elders, your life group leader ... you could even send us a postcard from your trip! We're not trying to go Big Brother on you ... we simply want to be able to pray for you while you're away and encourage you upon your return. We're a family, so it's our joy to celebrate summer adventures with you!

Kenton and his late wife Karen arrived in Guadalajara many years ago with the dream of planting a large mother church of 1,000 members in 10 years. Their dream was that this church would then provide the leadership for the planting of 20 other churches around the city. In the last 20 years, the main church, Rey de Reyes (King of Kings) has grown to four services on Sunday, including one in English. This church also has seven daughter churches in different stages of growth, and a ministry among the Purépecha Indians in the nearby state of Michoacan.


Rey de Reyes Church recently observed its 20th anniversary with a 2-day celebration. In attendance was the president of the General Assembly of the National Presbyterian Church of Mexico, along with the church plant teams from the 7 daughter churches. Also attending were Kenton's brother and wife, who are missionaries in Ometepec, Mexico, along with representatives from several PCA churches in the U.S. and MTW personnel.

In March of this year, Kenton and his wife, Adriana, spent a week in Atlanta with MTW, where Adriana went through the process of officially being admitted to the Mission to the World family. This consisted of four full days tests, interviews, and talks. Kenton and Adrianna are very thankful for the support from the MTW staff.





MISSIONS TEAM REPORT




Pinewoods Disaster Response Ministry
