From the desk of Senior Pastor Joel Treick

It's hard to believe that summer is almost over ... and we're getting ready for our **Fall Kick-Off!** One of the things we're really excited about as we gear back up for the new "church year" is a new opportunity to volunteer



with the Pinewoods Disaster Response Team. If you were there when Bruce Cullen spoke for Community Life, you already saw some of the amazing work our volunteers have done to assist the victims of natural disasters. Well ... we're getting ready to step it up a notch or two! This month, Pinewoods purchased a new trailer, so we can transport tools, supplies, and volunteers to disaster areas throughout the Gulf Coast. (On second thought, we should probably let the volunteers ride in the car.)

This month, I would like to interview **Bruce Cullen**, who's not only the chairman of the Pinewoods Disaster Response Team, he's the chairman of the Gulf Coast Presbytery Disaster Response Team. As you'll see, God has been preparing Bruce for something like this for many years. Along with an amazing testimony of God's grace, Bruce brings many years of work with the Red Cross, and even a degree in Emergency Management from LSU. (There's probably a football joke in there ... but let's move on!)

Without further ado ... here's Bruce Cullen!

Pastor Joel: Tell us a little bit about how you became a Christian. Were you brought up in a Christian home? Did you become a Christian later in life?

Bruce Cullen: I was not brought up in a Christian home, but from a very early age God was always behind the scenes pursuing me. I did not have a normal childhood; it was quite difficult at times. My family considered themselves Catholic although they never attended church, except for my maternal grandmother whom I was very close with. As a child, from time to time there always seemed to be people from a local church that would come by on Sundays and bring my sister and I to church. When I was about 10 or 11 years old a couple that were taking us to church asked if they could have us baptized at the church they attended, and so we were. As I grew up and had a family of my own, I rarely attended church and I always felt convicted about not going. In 2003 I had made the decision to follow Jesus and my life has never been the same since.

PJ: Tell us a little bit about your wife. When did you meet Sue? How old were you? Did you know you wanted to marry her right away? (Did she know she wanted to marry YOU right away?!) What has marriage taught you about the gospel?

BC: Sue and I had both been single parents and not dating much for over ten years. Both of us had separately committed to not remarrying unless we knew the person was who God had intended for us to marry, and that the marriage would be God centered. We met on an online personals dating site. After many long email exchanges and phone calls we had our first date at a local coffee shop. Well that coffee turned into a full day of being together, ending at a pier on Lake Ponchartrain, watching the sunset. At the end we looked at each other and I literally became weak and my heart started pounding. I knew then she was the one. I later found out that the next day she went to work and had told a coworker she could marry me. That was in January 2009 and we were married in November that same year.

PJ: You and Sue have been members at Pinewoods for a little over a year. How did you find us? Did you do a lot of "church shopping" before you decided Pinewoods was the place for you?

BC: We found Pinewoods through a search on the Gospel Coalition website. We came to Pensacola for a week to look at potential houses to buy and decided to visit Pinewoods. It was Easter Sunday. We left service that day saying how much we loved the service and it felt like home. We returned two months later after buying a house and visited a second time. When we walked out that day we knew we had found our church home.

PJ: Every Sunday ... I see you have at least two or three grandchildren with you! How many children and grandchildren do you have?

BC: We have 5 children, and 11 grandchildren.

PJ: You've taken on a big role with discipling your grandchildren. What advice do you have for grandparents who find themselves in a similar role with their own grandchildren?

BC: We can know that what Psalms 92:14-15 says holds true; "They still bear fruit in old age; they are ever full of sap and green, to declare that the LORD is upright; he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him." Grandparents may often have more developed spiritual gifts and wisdom than their parents do. We must share those gifts with our grandchildren so that their spiritual walk will be strengthened.

PJ: Since I've known you, you've always had a heart for helping the victims of natural disasters. Where do you think that comes from? What led you to want to study that at LSU? BC: Growing up I had to live with my grandparents a few times. They were both very kind and generous people always showing me examples of caring for others that were in some sort of need. So I guess that's where learning to help others started. I decided to make a major career change in 2005. I began working for the American Red Cross Disaster Services, just a few months before Hurricane Katrina hit. I had also planned to start college at night that fall semester but was not sure of what I really wanted to major in. After my experience at the Red Cross and with Hurricane Katrina I sensed that the field of Disaster Science/Emergency Management was the direction God was moving me in, so I declared my major at LSU in Disaster Science Management.

PJ: Recently, Pinewoods purchased a disaster response trailer. How do you think that will help us respond to natural disasters?

BC: The trailer is truly a blessing for mercy ministries. Having the trailer will give our disaster response team the ability to transport all the necessary disaster response equipment and tools for a variety of disaster scenarios. It will also provide additional storage to transport critical recovery supplies such as water, construction materials, flood/cleaning buckets, etc.

PJ: If someone wants to be part of the Disaster Response Team, what do they have to do? Is it open to anyone who wants to get involved? Are you collecting supplies?

BC: If someone would like to be a part of the response team they can contact me by email cullenbt@yahoo.com, or my cell (225)715-9274. It is open to everyone however the capacity in which an individual can serve in may be determined by experience, age, or physical ability. But there is something for everyone to do. Even if you cannot go on a deployment there is always a lot of behind the scenes coordination going on to make the teams response successful. We currently have a financial donation drive going on for the purchase of supplies for the Flood/Cleaning buckets and hygiene kits that we prepare and deliver to disaster victims. Once we buy the supplies we will announce to the church a date when we will assemble and prepare the complete product and have ready for distribution.

We also have quarterly meetings where everyone is invited to attend.

PJ: How can we pray for you? How can we pray for the Disaster Response Team?

BC: Sue and I are so blessed and thankful for our Pinewoods church family. Our prayer needs would pertain to our growth as grandparents, working to present and share the Gospel of Christ to our children and grandchildren.

For the Disaster Response Team; first and most important is the safety of our team while traveling and working in a disaster relief operation, and that abundant resources will be available when a disaster strikes.

Thanks again for doing this, Bruce! We're looking forward to doing all we can to demonstrate the love of Christ to those who need it the most.

Judy and Alberto Nunez serve with FRIDLA - Friends of the Disabled in Latin America.

Judy reports that FRIDLA had a fruitful trip to Bolivia, and that God's hand was evident in every aspect of the trip. The container of medical mobility equipment received a green light to pass through Bolivian Customs without being opened. This eliminated the need to hire 4 or more trucks to transport the equipment to Santa Cruz, 20 miles from the port.

Over 30 children were custom-fitted for equipment, along with many adults. FRIDLA does not usually ship over-sized walkers or wheelchairs as they very seldom encounter very obese recipients. While in Bolivia on this trip, one of Judy's taxi drivers asked if FRIDLA could assist his 500-lb. Uncle William, who was in need of a walker. The latest container included an extra-wide walker, and the warehouse contained a 28" wide wheelchair leftover from last year's shipment. The team was able to custom-fit both the walker and the wheelchair for William, who is now using the walker for exercise and mobility around the house, and the wheelchair to attend doctor appointments. William and his mother are believers, but his nephew and wife (the taxi driver) are not. Please pray for them to come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

During this trip, Judy and Alberto encountered many handicapped children. Arturo is deaf and cannot walk without assistance. FRIDLA fitted Arturo with a walker and a stroller. Another child who was helped is Daniel, 10-yrs-old. Daniel can only sit with his legs crossed or lies back, and he never opens his eyes. FRIDLA was able to provide a tilt-in-place wheelchair so that Daniel could lay back or sit up as needed. Judy reports that there are so many cases of handicapped children in Bolivia. The government does not provide any assistance for these children. Many times when a child is born with special needs one or both of the parents may abandon them.

Scott and Christine serve in a sensitive ministry.

Scott and Christine are grateful for many evidences of God's presence and provision as they journey through this season of transition. Their oldest son, Benjamin, graduated from high school in May, and will start classes at the University of Central Florida on August 20. For the rest of the family, the transition means continued progress toward moving back overseas in late August, as they will serve in a regional leadership role.

During this summer, Scott and Christine have enjoyed visiting churches and spending time with family and friends in South Carolina, Georgia, Iowa, Illinois, Louisiana and North Florida. During a break in those travels, the Lord gave them the opportunity to spend time with colleagues and family in Christ from the city to which they are preparing to move back.

The LDI ministry has been very active in the past few months. They have hosted dozens to hundreds of people each month from the community for concerts and other events at the church. The most recent

events were two concerts that were part of the I*** Jazz Festival. These opportunities continue to expose many people to the church who would otherwise never have any connection. In mid-May Pastor T came to the U.S. on a 10 day trip to visit partners in Baltimore, Greenville and Seneca, SC and Atlanta. He also led a 2 day gathering in Washington DC of other LDI partners.

The ministry continues to plan for an October gathering in I*** of leaders from the surrounding countries. This is a rare opportunity for local leaders to meet with others who are serving in similar contexts in their respective countries.

Scott and Christine are grateful to everyone who has inquired, who has prayed, and who has given toward the much-needed repairs and improvements of the nearly 150 year old sanctuary and surrounding garden. They trust and pray that these investments will serve the congregation and the ministry well for many years ahead.

Teresa got a side job working with VIPKID (an online ESL teaching group) and is really enjoying teaching these sweet Chinese children.

We miss:

We miss belonging to the culture and nation in which we reside. This has been difficult. Now having passed 18 months since we left the States, we are beginning to realize and remember more poignantly the things we miss.

We miss being a vested part of the long-term work that the Lord is doing in our city. Our hearts are still with the work happening in Medellín, and it is hard (but good) to be constantly pulled that direction.

We miss a hot July and a cold Christmas. Silly as that may seem it remains true...hot chocolate on the 4th?!

We have been struggling with how expensive it is to live in Melbourne. This is not bad, but it has been a test for how to use our finances wisely and well.
