From the desk of Senior Pastor Joel Treick



Greetings from Dallas! As I write this, I'm getting ready to return from General Assembly, our annual gathering of Teaching and Ruling Elders in the Presbyterian Church in America. We had a busy agenda, but it was a great time of thinking, praying, worshipping, and enjoying the communion of the saints.

Here are some highlights and developments from the trip ...

I arrived on Tuesday afternoon and caught up with two pastor friends of mine, one from Austin, TX and another from Bowie, Maryland. We got caught up on family life, discussed the books we're reading, the series we're preaching, and traded some pastoral wisdom about church issues that come up from time to time. (Thankfully, my stories were entirely positive ... and I'm not just saying that because this is the Pinewoods Newsletter!) We were joined by a ruling elder from the Reformed Presbyterian Church in Bowie, and after the meal he said, "Wow! I feel like we've known each other our whole lives!" Isn't it amazing how the gospel of Jesus Christ brings people together? That was a common theme throughout the week. I would meet new friends who I'm going to spend eternity with ... and it was great! In spite of some spirited debates about controversial issues (see below), I sensed an overall positive and encouraging attitude among all the elders and their families.

On Wednesday afternoon, we had our first worship service. The preaching pastor was the outgoing Moderator of the General Assembly, Rev. Dr. Irwyn Ince. Dr. Ince preached a powerful sermon about pressing on in our calling as pastors and evangelists. It's hard sometimes, but the grace of God, given to us in the person of Jesus Christ, makes it all worthwhile.

This is somewhat of an aside, but Dr. Ince was the first African-American Moderator of a PCA General Assembly. He certainly won't be our last, as there are a number of amazing African-American Teaching and Ruling Elders in our denomination. Nevertheless, I think it's worth nothing that by God's grace, we're a more diverse denomination than we were when I was ordained twelve years ago. God willing, we'll continue to make greater progress with recruiting and celebrating the gifts of all God's people!

In case you were wondering, that's not a liberal idea or a conservative idea ... it's a biblical idea! In Revelation 7:9-10, John tells us, "After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, 'Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" The more our churches look like heaven, the more we'll demonstrate to the world that the gospel really is "good news of great joy, for all kinds of people." (Luke 2:10)

One more quick note: The music during the Wednesday worship was incredible! Kate's more of a classical music aficionado than I am, but I can truly say the choir and the orchestra were spectacular. There were well over 1,000 people singing glorious songs of praise to God ... again, a little bit of heaven here on earth. (According to the book of Revelation, heaven will be very diverse, and very loud!)

After the service, we elected a new Moderator, Ruling Elder Howie Donahoe from Seattle. He did a fine job of keeping things moving and making sure Robert's Rules of Order and the Rules of Assembly Operation were followed to the letter. He had a bit of help from our Stated Clerk, Roy Taylor, who announced his retirement after 22 years of service, effective next year.

On Wednesday, I was happy to have lunch with two of our missionary partners! I won't give you all the details, but they are supervising an internship for one of our members. I heard many great stories about that member and the work that person is doing overseas! (This sounds very cloak and dagger ... but I'm often told that I'm not allowed to mention anyone's names because there is real danger from extremists in some parts of the world ... and I have no desire to put any of our brothers and sisters in harm's way.)

After hearing from fraternal delegates from other Reformed / Presbyterian denominations, we heard from our various committees and agencies, which was very helpful. The PCA voted to stay in the National Association of Evangelicals, which was somewhat controversial because the NAE has become a bit more political in recent years, making statements about a wide variety of social issues. Ultimately, the

Assembly decided that the benefits of being salt and light in the NAE outweighed the negatives of being associated with a group that sometimes makes statements that don't align with our political and theological views.

Another major development was our adoption of the Nashville Statement on Human Sexuality, which was authored by the Council of Biblical Manhood and Womanhood. It's a very clear, helpful, biblical statement, signed by familiar names like John Piper, James Dobson, J.I. Packer, D.A. Carson, Ligon Duncan, R.C. Sproul, Rosaria Butterfield, Sam Allberry, and many others.

To further the conversation about human sexuality, the PCA appointed a study committee to address some of the controversial issues of our day. Hopefully, this document will be a helpful pastoral resource for all of us as we seek to introduce all our friends and neighbors to Jesus, including many of our friends and family members who identify with the LGBTQ+ community. (Frankly, I'm not even sure if that's the best way to describe what I'm talking about. I might have left out some letters, and I'm not exactly sure if I understand what the + stands for. Again, I'm hoping to get some guidance from the study committee, so I can use language and terminology that glorifies God as I seek to reach out to friends and neighbors. The gospel of Jesus Christ is the one hope for ALL PEOPLE, even those who struggle mightily with sexual sin.)

Well, that's the report! I was happy to see some former professors and classmates from Westminster Seminary in California ... I was happy to see old friends from First Presbyterian in Chattanooga ... I was happy to connect with some church-planter friends of mine ... the reunion stories are beyond the scope of this newsletter article, so I'll leave it there.

Overall, I'm very happy with the state of the Presbyterian Church in America, and I'm glad that Pinewoods is part of a denomination that is dedicated to the authority of God's word, celebrates the best parts of our Reformed tradition, and recognizes the urgency of the Great Commission. We're not a perfect church, we don't belong to a perfect denomination, but we worship a Great God who loved us so much that he sent his one and only Son Jesus to die on the cross for us ... that we might become Spirit-filled children of the King! Praise be to God for his amazing grace!

- more spiritually mature families to join in with us, as well as others God is calling to himself; Simon as he'll be alone in leading after 2 years of having Andrew's great help
- healing of the inflammation in Jan's right biceps tendon which has been quite painful and has hindered her shoulder progress; she had 2 injections in her arm this week and so far is doing much better; encouragement for both of us as we were feeling near the finish line with health issues for now; God to be glorified through our lives and us to choose contentment daily
- please pray for greater wisdom in our scheduling as we need to learn to pace ourselves better with Jan's lower energy level, especially as we consider planning the remainder of our home ministry assignment for October and November
- us to eagerly look to Christ and his coming (Philippians 3:20-21, our passage for this year) and that we will rely on his power; that we will find him enough whatever our circumstances
- us to be an example of relying on Christ in adversity and thus be an encouragement to our GMM family and others around us

#### Evan and Bonnie serve in a sensitive mission.

Evan reports that their family has settled into a somewhat normal routine. They are thankful to have made it through the hot season. It has started raining about once a week, which brings in cool air. The difference has been wonderful! It no longer reaches 105 F every day, which makes doing anything so much easier, and the family finds they have much more energy throughout the day. Lucas has started using some words and enjoys running away and hiding whenever it's bath time. He has also begun climbing on anything possible. He and Charlotte are turning into real playmates, and it's a joy for Evan and Bonnie to watch them grow together.

There have been some troubling political developments in the northern part of their country. A Catholic Church and a protestant church were attacked within the course of a week. In each of these churches, six people were killed, and several others were wounded. The buildings in the surrounding areas were looted and cars were burned. This has saddened them and has definitely been on their minds a great deal. However, Evan and Bonnie feel safe in their locality, and there does not seem to be any reason to think that the problems will reach their immediate area. These problems have had little effect on their ministry as of yet and they have no reason to fear that this will change anytime soon. The biggest problem that they have encountered is that they are not able to leave the immediate vicinity and venture into the surrounding countryside. But all things considered, Evan and Bonnie are thankful to be where they are and that the Lord has seen fit to continue to use them. Please continue to pray for this country and the regions that are experiencing turmoil.

In happier news, the ministry is going very well, and Evan's French is getting much better. Bonnie's fluency is also improving. She is about to begin with a new teacher who they feel will be a better fit for her, and they are excited for this change.

Evan is currently involved in several outreach projects in their neighborhood. Along with one of their partnering pastors, Evan has handed out pamphlets in the surrounding area of the church about church services

and what it means to be reformed, and has continued to regularly run a children's club, where the children play soccer and then come back to the church for a bible study. During this process, one woman came up to the pastor and Evan and asked questions about the ministry. They handed her a pamphlet and gave her more information. She then attended church the next two Sundays and informed them she wanted to be a Christian. Evan explained to her the centrality of faith in Jesus to save her from her sins.

Mark and Nicola Faires serve with SEND North, an organization that supports and administers remote ministry activities throughout Alaska, as well as in the Yukon Territory and Northwest Territories in Canada.

Mark spent the majority of the spring prepping SEND's Cherokee 6 (a 6-seat airplane) for a new paint job. It took a lot of time getting all the old paint stripped off and making necessary repairs, but with the help of another SEND coworker, he got it done just in time. While they were away at our annual training in Soldotna, Nicola's dad and his friend, Bob Taylor (a professional painter), flew up from Iowa and worked feverishly to complete the paint job. It was quite the operation, requiring 146 total man-hours in a matter of five days, but they got it done and the plane looks brand new again. What a huge blessing to have that completed!! Mark's goal is to finish the remaining maintenance repairs and have the plane up in the air again soon.

A 10-person work team from SC visited the Faires to help with various projects around the property. The main project was moving one of the storage sheds to a different location on the property and finishing converting it from a shed to a dry cabin. The cabin will be used for interns and overflow sleeping space for work teams. The team made great progress, and God's provision in the details of the project were amazing.

An aviation intern will be working with Mark this September and October. The Faires are really excited that he will be coming and hope that his time there will be as rewarding for him and for them. Please be in prayer for him as he makes all the necessary plans for his travels.

Recently, Mark has completed several flights for a nearby Bible camp, flying groceries and camp staff. The hope is for him to be able to be of help with some more flights, though that will be contingent on their new baby's arrival plans. Please pray for safety in flights both locally and for the camps all around the state. Pray that the kids that attend the camps will have hearts that are receptive to the Gospel.

#### **Prayer Requests:**

- Please be in prayer with Mark as he evaluates and pursues the needed tools, resources, and perhaps training, to better maintain and equip SEND North's aircraft.
- Please be in prayer over the status and future ownership of the airport. It would be the Faires' desire that a fellow believer would buy the property but ultimately they pray that whoever takes over management would be favorable to their mission.

#### Pastor Joel's Summer Book Picks in Our Library





Hitler.



Screwtape holds an administrative post in the bureaucracy ("Lowerarchy") of Hell, and acts as a mentor to his nephew Wormwood, an inexperienced (and incompetent) tempter."




