From the desk of Senior Pastor Joel Treick

We have some exciting news this month! After a long, arduous search, I'm happy to announce that the elders of Pinewoods have called a new Assistant Pastor, David Balzer!



David comes to us from Grace Church for All Nations (PCA) in Stone Mountain, GA, where he's served as the Senior Pastor since 2014. Before that, David was an Assistant Pastor at Community Presbyterian Church in Moody, AL, an Interim Pastor at Grace Presbyterian Church in Chelsea, AL, and an RUF Campus Minister at East Tennessee State University and King College in Johnson City and Bristol, TN.

Before David became an ordained pastor in 2003, he received his BA in Humanities from Warren Wilson College in Swannanoa, NC and his M.Div. from Greenville Presbyterian Theological Seminary in Greenville, SC.

David is married with three children. His wife Laura grew up attending our sister church, Briarwood (PCA) in Birmingham, AL. Their children Ben and Cate (twins!) are both 9-years-old and they will be entering 4th grade. Their third child has not yet been born ... so we'll give you more information on the youngest Balzer when we meet him / her on his / her birthday!

So why did we choose David to be our new Assistant Pastor? The first factor was experience. David comes to us with 16 years of pastoral experience in a variety of different contexts. He's ministered to college students, middle school and high school students, young families, and seniors. Since Pinewoods is a multi-generational church, we think his experiences in ministry will allow him to connect with all of our members. The second factor is giftedness. We think David is a uniquely gifted evangelist and a natural "people person." He loves Jesus and he loves connecting with people! Since we would like David to focus on connecting unbelievers to Jesus (outreach) and believers to the church (assimilation) ... we think he's the perfect man for that job. The third factor is missions. David has a passion for cross-cultural missions that very much aligns with our own passion for cross-cultural missions. He's spent time in London, Haiti, Greece, Ukraine, and Jamaica. As we continue to plead with God to raise up 1% of our congregation for cross-cultural missions, we think David's passion for the lost world will be a real blessing to us. The fourth factor is the Holv Spirit. This one is the hardest one to explain, but it's definitely the most important! After much prayer, we think that God has orchestrated this connection. David loves Jesus, just like we do. He truly believes God is calling him to Pinewoods, and we agree! We think God is

calling David here, and we're so happy about what God is going to do in our church and our city through David's faithful service.

There's much more to be said ... but I thought I would close with David's testimony, in his own words.

I didn't grow up in the church. I didn't trust in Christ until I was a senior in high school. The first person (that I actually respected) to tell me of my need for Jesus was my elementary school teacher, Mr. Wise, who I would visit sometimes in high school. God also used my friend's uncle Jerry to talk to me about Jesus and the Bible when I ran into him in McDonald's. He gave me a Good News Bible that day, and I read Matthew that night. Then God used a complete stranger, Joe Cordosa, the very next day (at McDonald's again) to share the Gospel with me. He told me about the lambs in the Old Testament having to die because God is good, and someone had to die for sin. And then he told me that Jesus is the true Lamb of God who was the perfect sacrifice. This is when the Gospel started to click for me. Then I started visiting Pinewood Presbyterian Church in the fall of my senior year because I thought if I joined I could get a scholarship to Warren Wilson College. (I didn't know the difference between PCA and PCUSA.) But God used my mixed motives to put me in a good church, and after the second worship service I visited, I prayed with the youth pastor, Steve Reese, and I repented and trusted in Christ. God gave me immediate assurance, and He helped me to grow in my faith through that church. Pinewood helped me see the Scriptures as the Word of God and discover a sense of calling to preach. Covenant Reformed Presbyterian and RUF in Asheville challenged me with the doctrines of grace and gave me a sense of Christian community, and I found great comfort in these things. My ordination and service with RUF and involvement with Christ Community Church in Johnson City has helped me grow in my experience of God's love and of the centrality of the Gospel. Laura has helped me accept God's grace more. Getting to be Ben and Cate's dad has helped me see more of my need for grace.

I would love to pastor a church that connects well with unchurched people or people who have had a difficult time with the church. This church would be simple and very relational. We would hope to do a small number of things and to do them well. Through Gospel-Centered worship, community groups, and individual relationships, we would hope to help people come to know Christ and to serve Him in His kingdom with great blessing to our city and the world.

God changes us by His love, and His love is seen most clearly in His Son. Ministry is using your gifts to communicate God's love through Christ in word and deed in a way that grows the family of God in love for God, for one another, and for those who don't yet know Him. Ministry helps people know who God is and become more like Him to show how wonderful He is. In ministry we show love to grow love because this is what we were meant for. (Based on Eph. 3:14-21; 4:7-16)

Amen! We're looking forward to welcoming the Balzer family to Pinewoods! They arrive on Saturday, August 10, and will be worshipping with us on Sunday, August 11. Praise God!

Clay and Darlene Quarterman serve with the Evangelical Reformed Seminary of Ukraine.

In May, Clay taught an intensive seminary course in Kiev (35 lectures) on the History of Mission—praying for God to raise up missionaries from Ukraine to go to "places beyond" -- places that we cannot go. As he taught the course, Clay became acutely aware of the importance of an educated ministry and of building long-term. Former seminary student Ivan Bespalov has already been pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Kiev for 20 years!

The 'greatest missionaries' often had only 10 to 20 converts, yet:

- 1) They learned the language and translated the Bible.
- 2) They loved Jesus and the people they served.
- 3) They raised money (even the so-called 'faith missions').
- 4) They WENT! (although they often died young or served short terms).
- 5) They had serious character flaws, but God used them anyway.
- 6) They inspired others by their vision.

Clay was struck again that it is not our Human mission, but GOD'S mission. He will do it – for God can use a broken stick.

ERSU graduate Alexander Buichkov has been accepted to do distance study at Covenant Seminary this fall, but he still needs funding. Please pray for funds to come into account #95987 at MTW for the "Ukraine Pastoral Intern Scholarship". Alexander needs \$20k more to provide for his ThM program. He's working to provide part of this funding himself, even while pastoring a church plant in central Ukraine.

ERSU Seminary has announced the Dedication of the new building for September 14th. Darlene and Clay plan to attend, and while there Clay will teach a seminar. Seminary will be in session; they will be able to see their beloved students in action.

Tony and Amber Elswick serve with MTW in Panama.

First steps with the Jungle Ministry: Tony has been to the village of La Reserva in the Darien Jungle twice with the Sports Xchange missionaries to help establish a relationship. On his first visit, Tony had a chance to play a recording of the Bible for some of the villagers in their tribal language, Embera. It was the first time they have ever heard the Bible in their tribal language! On his second visit, the group brought the Jesus Film and played it in Embera and Spanish. A few other firsts: it was the first time the community has come together to have a movie night AND the first movie they had seen in Embera. It's probably the only movie in Embera. Tony and the Sports Xchange missionaries will return in August to have a worship service and to introduce the training. If you want to see the videos Tony put together of each trip you can watch the first one here and the second one here.

Building in the City: Now that the ball is rolling in the first two targeted indigenous villages, Tony and Amber are trying to focus on building the seminary in the city. Panama is very different than Nicaragua and they are working to adapt their work to this new environment. They do have some great national partners that are allowing them to use their church for meetings and Tony is excited about the impact that an accessible seminary will have on the Church in and around Panama City.

Staying Connected to Nicaragua: Tony is continuing his work in Nicaragua, focusing on continued support for the learning communities and preparing several men for ordination exams and ministry. The distance has increased the challenges, but Tony is able to connect with them through web chats to continue the training.

- Please pray that the Lord would deepen Tony's relationship with the La Reserva jungle community and would raise up leaders and worshipers in La Reserva.
- Please pray that the Lord would open doors and connect Tony with the future students and pastors in and around Panama City.

David and Jan serve in a sensitive ministry.

David and Marcia serve in a sensitive ministry.

Each Sunday after the worship service at their church, David and Marcia meet with those who speak P... to review that Sunday's sermon. This gives them the opportunity to make sure the P... speakers have at least understood the main points of the sermon, and it gives them a chance to ask any questions they have in F..., their mother tongue. Because these people do not have a strong background of Scripture knowledge, some things they completely miss, and some things need a lot more context for them. David and Marcia report that not one Sunday goes by without a question or comment that calls them to wonder at the richness of God's revelation to us.

Prayer requests:

- Marcia is coming to the US for a quick visit with our newest granddaughter, Julian Esther, Gareth and Cassandra's third daughter. Praise God for new generations to love Him.
- David is considering whether he should do another book table closer to church. Pray for wisdom about where he should spend his time and efforts.
- We would love to start a meeting during the week for the P... speakers. What evening, where, and would people be able to come on top of jobs? These are all questions to be answered and considered.
- Pray for the P... as almost all are looking for housing or have issues with housing expenses.
- Pray that the P... would be consistent in coming to Sunday morning worship. The 6-7 who do come consistently are becoming more and more part of the church family which is a praise. Another praise is that they seem to feel committed to each other and care for each other. Pray that God will grow both their connection to the church and to each other.
- Praise God for Chuck's improving health (Chuck is our team leader) and pray that God would continue to strengthen him.


This month we are highlighting the prayer requests from three chaplains who serve at bases in the Pacific – two in Hawaii and one in South Korea.
