#### From the desk of Senior Pastor Joel Treick





There are changes in the air! It's starting to cool down a little bit after a long, hot summer, Thanksgiving will be here before we know it, then Advent, the Christmas Party, the Christmas Eve "Lessons and Carols" service ... not to mention final exams, term papers, and all the other little things that have to happen as we close out an eventful 2018.

One of the new things we're excited about at Pinewoods is the beginning of a new sermon series! We just finished our Fall Series in the book of 2 Timothy, and November marks the beginning of a new series in the book of Luke. Luke is one of my favorite books in the Bible because it's the longest biography of Jesus we have. At 1,151 verses, Luke is not only the longest of the four gospels, it's the longest book in the New Testament! Of those 1,151 verses, 568 of them are simply the words of Jesus.

But it's not just the length of the book that's so impressive, it's the uniqueness of the material. Matthew, Mark, and Luke have 60% of their material in common. There are a number of events that appear in more than one gospel account. But, according to Professor Mark Allen Powell, Luke has **45** unique contributions to the story of Jesus' life and ministry.

I'm going to give you the list (see below), but before I do, I want to encourage you to *think* about these unique contributions. Imagine not having any account of these people, places, events, and teachings on this list. Imagine not knowing who **Zacchaeus** is! Imagine not knowing the names **Mary** and **Martha**. Imagine Christmas without the shepherds "watching over their flocks by night." Imagine Christmas without the **Magnificat**. Imagine never hearing the **Parable of the Prodigal Son** or the **Parable of the Good Samaritan**. When I think about it that way, I'm so thankful for Luke! I'm so thankful that he set out to write an orderly account of the life of Jesus! Here's the list ...

I have the feeling that this series is going to make me love God more. I have the feeling that this series is going to change some of my attitudes towards the weak, the poor, children, and those who live on the margins. I have a feeling this book is going to awaken my love for the Holy Spirit. I have a feeling that this book is going to deepen my prayer life. I have a feeling this book is going to re-kindle my joy! If you're willing to go on this journey with me, I think the Holy Spirit will use Luke's gospel to do the same for you.

I'm looking forward to this new season in the life of our church!

#### **Pinewoods Disaster Response Ministry**

The Pinewoods Presbytery Disaster Response teams, Mcllwain Presbytery Disaster Response Team, and the Grace Presbytery Disaster Response team were on the ground on day 3 after the storm. We served 300 hot meals and delivered; 4 generators, 100 gallons of fuel, 150 gallons of potable water, 1200 bottles of drinking water, a van load of baby diapers and wipes, tarped roofs, removed trees and limbs off of houses and roads, while sharing the love of God through our words and deeds. Many tears were shed. We serve a mighty God.

**Heather** serves in a sensitive ministry.

Here is some news from Heather, in her own words:

Life has been crazy cool, different, at times frustrating, but all together beautiful as I have started this new chapter of my life.

I arrived here almost a month ago, and I still sometimes while sitting in on the train, walking down a street, or sitting in a Grab (basically an uber) sit back and laugh in unbelief that I am 20 years old and living in KL but then I thank God or all the roads He has lead me down to get me here today.

One of the families on my team so graciously let me move in with them for the first week of being here. My teammate found an apartment online with two girls and I really liked it and we just prayed that if this is where I was supposed to be it would work out. Well it did work out and I moved in and my housemates have been such a blessing. They are two girls and are so fun to be around. They have been so helpful as I move to a new country where I do not know much about the culture.

Learning an entirely new culture takes as lot of time, as I have realized. At first everything was so new to me, I didn't know what was culturally appropriate, whether or not to tip the waiter, how to use the public

transportation here, how to eat with my finger (properly), which hand to eat with, what to wear, and so many other things. Overtime (through trial and error in some cases) I am starting to learn these things. Sometimes it turns out I have to go through a pretty comical situation to figure these things out. At times the little things can be really frustrating, like not knowing what stores will carry what you need, or not knowing how to pronounce anything, or sweating every time I walk outside (or in my own house because I only have aircon in my room and we only use it at night), or getting lost and switching the train 5 times because you don't understand the instructions you were given by the train worker, but it is such a humbling thing to see life outside of the little bubble that I lived in in America. I still have a billion things to learn but it has been really beautiful to get to know these people and this diverse city as well.

I jumped right into the swing of things when I got here. I started working along side one of my teammates and assisting her in teaching the classes to the R... women. She trained me for the first week and half and I got to watch her interact and love these women. Then she went out of town for work and I was left with the task of teaching. She is an amazing teacher and I was slightly intimidated at first about this task. But God was so gracious with me and reminded me that He is the great I am and I am nothing. Nothing I could ever do would be enough. No love I could ever show would ever amount to His love. What a comforting truth this was to know that God is enough and that I would never be walking through any part of this alone.

Teaching has been fun and at times challenging, considering I do not speak their language and they speak little English. But these women have such a brave and determined spirit to try and soak in all that they can learn. More than teaching them though, it has been a blessing getting to know these women and some of their stories. I have loved just getting to spend time with them and love them. No matter how frustrated I can get with trying to explain a complicated matter, God is always so good to remind me what my main reason for being here is. Yes, I am here to help them learn English, but even more so I am here to love them like Jesus does.

I have been able to really get to know one woman, her daughter, and her son. They are so welcoming to me and I have been invited over several times. On Tuesdays I get to tutor them on a more one on one level, which is such a cool opportunity. I am so excited to see how God will use this relationship and to just get to show them the love of Jesus.

I have had a lot of moments here where I just am amazed by how awesome our God is and how GOOD He is to continue to show a wretched sinner like me, more of Himself. I call these moments "God smacks". Like Wowzer I am smacked with some truth of the Gospel. It's that moment when a truth I have heard a billion times all of sudden just clicks and makes sense.

One truth that God so graciously has reminded me while being here is how I am absolutely nothing and how great He is. HE IS THE I AM. This truth has proven itself to be so important in my time here, as life is changing and Satan tries to make me feel doubt and confusion. God, Himself, the maker of Heaven and of Earth, loves me and is constant, and is powerful, and is for me, and is the greatest of all greats, He is the I am. What should I fear?

Another cool God smack I have really started to understand is just how precious and beautiful life is. Every moment we are given is so easily taken for granted but I am seeing just how important it is to take each moment that God has given me to love different people. How urgent the Gospel is because how lovely it is to be loved and to be known by God. The Gospel is an urgent message that should not be taken lightly. God's love is so beautiful, we should want all of the world to experience this. My prayer lately has been that I would never take for granted a single moment that I have been given here but instead live in such a way that I honestly feel the weight of this urgent message. Love with Christ's love every chance I get, share more of Him every chance I get. This is urgent.

#### **Praises and Prayers:**

- Definitely a praise that I found housing and have been able to spend time and bond with my roommates.
- Another praise is that I have been able to spend time with a lot of my team members and get to

- know their families and feel so supported by them.
- Please be in prayer for my roommates, that God would open doors for me to get to share the Gospel with them and speak truth and love into their lives.
- Be in prayer for my relationship with the R... women, especially the R... family that I get the opportunity to tutor. Pray that God would give me wisdom and words to speak.
- Be in prayer for my safety and that God would also give me wisdom as I navigate this city, a lot of times alone.
- A constant prayer that I pray and that I would ask you guys to join me in praying is that God would wreck my heart in whatever way possible to continue to show me more of Him.
- Please keep Heather in your prayers!

#### Chuck and Wyema serve in a sensitive ministry.

We reported last month that Chuck underwent heart surgery to replace his aortic heart valve. We are happy to report that the surgery was successful. Chuck is thankful for our prayers, and tells us that this ordeal was much harder than he ever dreamed it would be. And yet, throughout his time in the hospital he and Wyema were at peace, and they had a sense of God's presence with them.

Although Chuck is still weak, he gains some strength every day. After the surgery he could not walk more than a few minutes but can now walk slowly for about 30 minutes. Chuck is coming to terms with the fact that recovery will be slower than he anticipated.

- For the many people God raised up to pray. We have been overwhelmed by the many who have prayed for us, friends in the States, our church family here, dear Iranian/Afghan brothers and sisters here. We have felt the love of God through the body of Christ.
- For team members Joneses and Beavers who have taken over my duties during this time.
- Continue to pray for daily grace and help for Wyema as she cares for me.

#### Evan and Bonnie serve in a sensitive ministry.

We are pleased to report that Evan and Bonnie have reached their support goal, and will soon be joining their ministry team on another continent! They will arrive at their new location in mid-November, and they have asked for prayer for safe travels as they will be traveling with two young children, and for them and their loved ones as they say their good-byes.

#### **David and Marcia** serve in a sensitive ministry.

David and Marcia returned overseas in late July and had to hit the road running! Their co-worker and team leader Chuck was diagnosed with heart problems and subsequent surgery, so they have tried to take over some of his responsibilities, which included an Iranian pastor visiting and traveling with him to Belgium to meet with another Iranian group there. A church in Florida sent a mission team for 11 days, which was able to meet some of the Iranians, Afghans and others from many nations in their church. Marcia and David, with the help of their teammates are now preparing to host another mission team coming for 10 days in three weeks. They have also picked back up on our normal ministry opportunities including book table, meeting with the Persians after Sunday morning service, chai and chat at their house, and English language class. In the midst of the special events and normal activities David and Marcia have tried to visit and renew relationships after more than a year being away.

Pray for these men and women who come to our Persian group. Some are believers, some on the way, some just seeking. One woman began coming the first Sunday we returned, Mosh., and has asked many questions, and seems to have put her faith in Jesus as her Savior.

Pray for her as she seeks the truth and is set free in Jesus. One man for whom you prayed, Ha., received his leave to remain in the country recently. Praise the Lord. His joy and faith are attracting others to Jesus and encourage us all. He says Sunday is the best day of the

week for him. What an example to us! Pray for S. the Ghormeh Sabzi man. He needs a place to live and

better health. Pray for God's strength and comfort as he suffers from almost constant back pain and headaches from being beaten in his home country.

Booktable: Book table, which David does twice a week, continues to be interesting and surprising. One lady was very angry about our having religious literature on the table. Some Muslim men have complemented David about his beard. One Afghan kissed his hand and touched the Persian New Testament saying he respected our holy book. We gave him a

booklet to take home and read and hopefully come back and talk about. A young Muslim man asked David if he followed Jesus? example. He asked this question because a reference in the Quran says that the prophets are examples we are to follow. David shocked him by

replying, "No, I don't. Jesus is more than a prophet. Jesus is not just an example to be followed, he is my Saviour". Conversations at the book table are usually brief, and we don't often know how God will use them. Pray that David will have opportunities to talk with people who are truly seeking, and to those who will come to church to find

out more than a short conversation can convey.

#### **Praise and prayer requests:**

- Pray for the many opportunities Marcia has to talk with women in chai and chat and English class. Pray that she will know who to pursue and how to best talk about Jesus and get these ladies further into God's Word. Meeting and talking with individuals outside of class is the best way to talk about Jesus and answer their questions meaningfully, but Marcia doesn't have time to do that with everyone, so please pray for wisdom.
- Pray too about the time Marcia spends talking and counseling with the women, both believers and seekers, to encourage them to know and grow in Christ. It is both very rewarding and very exhausting, so pray for her to be wise in where she spends her time.
- Praise for the good time we had with one team that visited and prayer for the team coming in mid-November. It is good for the Persian believers here to see the people that have prayed for them and continue to pray for them. Pray that we will use the time with these teams well, both to encourage and inform them, and to encourage the people here. Pray that we will choose wisely as we arrange what to do and with whom to meet.
- Praise to God that our youngest son Evan has raised his support and is heading to W... A... soon. He and his wife and two children will stay with us eight precious days on their way. They will fly out early in the morning (and I do mean early. We will have to leave the house about 4:30 am) on the same day the new missions trip team will arrive. We will enjoy every minute God gives us with them and rejoice that they can start on this new ministry in W... A... Pray for them as they pack and say goodbyes, both of which are hard and constant in this life.
- Pray for Mosh mentioned earlier. She has made a profession of faith, the first step in this new life with Jesus. She needs to be prepared for baptism and learn what it means to be part of the family of God, the church. Pray that we will teach her well and wisely.
- Pray for the Meetings For Better Understanding with the local mosque. Our goal is to continue these meetings in January.
- Pray for Chuck our team leader for a good recovery from his heart surgery.

Ian and Heather serve in a sensitive ministry. The last few months have been quite busy for Ian and Heather and their ministry in W... A... In early September Ian taught a course on the doctrine of salvation to the MINTS students. The course went very well. Since the students have been with us for a couple of years now they are more willing to open up and ask question that are really close to their hearts. Often after class the students will come up to Ian and want to talk more. These after class discussions are something Ian really enjoys and he finds helpful in letting him know what he did well in the course or what he needs to improve on. During one of these discussions, on the last day of the course, one of the students told Ian that he now sees how unbiblical his teaching has been on salvation and that he knows that he has a lot of repenting to do before his congregation. Also, he asked if Ian would be willing to pray for

him that the Lord would give him the courage to be able to repent and set a good example for his church. It has been amazing to see how God has been using this theological training to help the churches in W... A...

- Pray for the two new church plants that have been started by some of the MINTS students. Pray that God would strengthen them and cause them to grow in numbers but also in their relationship with him.
- Pray for us as well since we have now gotten even busier.

- Please pray as well for Keith and Debbie as they continue to raise support. We hope to have them out here around April of 2019(if not before!).
- Pray for Heather and the kids. They started homeschooling again back in August. They just finished a week-long co-op on China. The kids enjoyed learning and playing together with other children. This year Daniel is in 4<sup>th</sup> grade, Amy is in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade, and Jonathan is in Kindergarten. Please pray for the kids and for Heather as they learn. Please pray specifically for Jonathan as we start working with him on learning to read, which can be a daunting task.

**Ben and Katie Nelson** serve with MTW in Midtown, Mobile, Alabama at Christ Redeemer, a PCA church plant.

After more than a year of preparation -- moving, raising financial support, gathering a core team, and praying for the Lord's direction, Christ Redeemer Church in Midtown Mobile celebrated their first service on Sunday evening, October 28<sup>th</sup>!!

The church staff and leadership team has recently recounted all the trails they have faced since embarking on this church planting journey. Among the core group they have experienced the loss of multiple parents, miscarriages, a team member's brain bleed, other major health issues, job changes, and multiple moves within the last 6 months. Ben shares this to remind us all that the only way that the church has reached this point is by the sheer grace of God. It is evident that God has wanted to do a work *in us*, even as we pray that he will work *through us*.
