

From the Desk of Sr Pastor Joel Treick

Last Saturday, I went axe-throwing with a group of men from Pinewoods. It was an interesting experience, to say the least! I managed to hit the target about 40% of the time. In terms of Major League Baseball, that would give me a .400 batting average, and would most



At one point during our excursion, we had a chance to meet the owner and his son. They're both originally from Philadelphia, where the father owns a company that manufactures bingo dotters. (They are also called bingo "dabbers." Apparently, this is a bone of contention in the bingo community.) The son had an idea for an axe-throwing business, the father invested, and Grizzly Axes was born. As the son said, "Beer and axe-throwing ... what could go wrong?!" Thankfully nothing did! (Maybe because we stuck to Cokes, potato chips, and hot wings.)

During our conversation with the owner, he asked, "So what brings you here?" I told him, "We're from Pinewoods Church." He seemed a little confused by that answer ... like maybe he expected us to be holding a Bible study or something. I told him, "We're just hanging out, being friends."

Sometimes, the best thing you can do on a Saturday, is spend a couple of hours with your friends. Why? I think it's because God made us for friendship. At the very beginning, after God created Adam, he said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him." (Genesis 2:18) In other words, "Adam needs a companion. Adam needs a friend."

So what does biblical friendship look like? I spent some time this morning reading the *Dictionary of Biblical Imagery* and I discovered some interesting insights into the nature and purpose of friendship. According to the author of the article, friendship involves *knitting of souls* and *face-to-face encounters* between "equals [who] are similar in class, interests and character, share meals and spend time together, and follow virtue." In other words, friends are people who, over time, form emotional, intellectual, and spiritual attachments with each other.

Think of the friendship between David and Jonathan in the Old Testament. In 1 Samuel 18:1, we read, "The soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul." These two friends were so close that they exchanged gifts with each other, embraced one another, wept

together, and made vows of loyalty with each other. (When Jonathan died, David kept his oath of loyalty by giving Jonathan's son Mephibosheth a seat at his table ... essentially offering him protection from a group of loyalists who thought David should kill anyone associated with the former king, King Saul.)

Think about some of Jesus' friendships in the New Testament. When Lazarus died, Jesus wept. Why? Because, according to John 11:11, Lazarus was Jesus friend. Most biblical interpreters believe that Jesus had a best friend ... John, who was called "the disciple whom Jesus loved." (John 20:2) Who can forget the riveting scene in John 19, when Jesus, who was about to die on the cross, instructed John to look after his mother Mary? They were, in terms of their friendship, "one soul." Perhaps this idea of friends as soulmates influenced John to use the term "friend" as a shorthand way of addressing other Christians. In 3 John 15, he wrote, "The friends greet you. Greet the friends, every one of them." When two people are in Christ, there's a sense in which their souls are knit together in friendship. Given that reality, the process of "becoming friends," for Christians is less about creating something that didn't exist before, and more about discovering something that already exists because of Jesus.

Probably the most revolutionary thing about Christian friendship is the idea that human beings can be friends with God. Ancient philosophers thought this was impossible, and perhaps even absurd, because of the great chasm that separates God (or the gods) and human beings. And yet, three times in the Bible (2 Chronicles 20:7; Isaiah 41:8; James 2:23), Abraham is called a "friend of God." In Exodus 33:11, we're told that God spoke to Moses, "face to face, as a man speaks to his friend."

We've already noted the connection Jesus had with Lazarus and John, but it's important to note that this was not a mere function of his human nature. Jesus, the fully divine Son of God, told the disciples, "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends ... No longer do I call you servants ... but I have called you friends." (John 15:13, 15) Why did Jesus die on the cross for us? Why did he lay down his life as a ransom for sinners? Because we're his friends, and Jesus is "a friend of sinners." (Luke 7:34)

Friendship matters! Friendship with God matters, and friendship with other people matters. That's true generally, but it's especially true in the church. We should love ALL of our neighbors (Mark 12:31), but especially those who are "of the household of faith." (Galatians 6:10)

The book of Proverbs famously observes, "Iron sharpens iron, and one friend sharpens another." (Proverbs 27:17) Sometimes that "sharpening" looks like axe-throwing. Sometimes it looks like a day at the beach or a backyard barbeque. Sometimes it sounds like a long phone call ... complete with many prayers, much laughter, and even some tears. In a world in which it seems like isolation is the "new normal," I want to encourage you to make friends. Join the Men's Group or the Women's Group. Go to a Life Group or a Sunday School class. You're going to have lunch after the worship service anyway, why not invite someone to join you?

There are so many ways to connect with other people. Life is short ... make friends!

Judy and Alberto Nunez serve with FRIDLA (Friends of the Disabled in Latin America).

Judy reports that their new ministry partners in Augusta, GA, Sons of Consolation Ministries, have been working hard to prepare the workshop and warehouse to store the donations of mobility equipment, and they have now begun the refurbishment process. SOC Ministries is also involved in prison/jail ministry, nursing home ministry, and various community projects throughout the year.

Judy began to suffer some health issues in February. She underwent some major surgery in June, and after a six-week recovery she has been able to resume her ministry and travels.

Judy and Alberto traveled to Bolivia in August to distribute the latest shipment of medical equipment. This latest shipment to Bolivia arrived safely, and contained 194 wheelchairs, 50 pediatric wheelchairs, 2 hospital beds, and numerous canes, walkers, rollators and 14 cases of Bibles.

As Judy and Alberto meet with physically handicapped adults and children and their family members they often have opportunities to proclaim the Gospel to them and provide them with Bibles. One Bolivian lady who received a wheelchair and a walker prayed with Alberto to receive Christ. The mother of a young girl who is both physically and mentally handicapped met with Judy and Alberto. They presented the Gospel to this young mother and prayed with her. One young man who suffers with Cerebral Palsy is unable to attend school even though he has a sound mind. He was very grateful for the Bible that Judy gave to him.

Praises and Prayer Requests:

- We praise God and thank each of you for your faithful prayer and financial support. God is using you to help us complete what HE has placed in our hearts. Even when we are in the USA preparing the equipment for shipping, He continues to change lives using the volunteers in Bolivia and Uruguay.
- Praise God and thank Him for answering prayers and supplying the donation of an almost new 2018 Ford Transit Van (flat top) with only 11,900 miles. Alberto has already made several trips to pick up chairs and parts. Alberto is thrilled!
- Please pray FRIDLA Peru for the tax-exempt status and the faithful board members. The wheels are moving in Lima. A board member from Tacna is in the process of traveling to Lima to complete the necessary paperwork. Pray for success. Those in need in southern Peru are waiting for God to answer our and their prayers.
- We understand God touched the Christian College students in Bolivia who were visiting the homes of those requesting mobility assistance. We look forward to meeting them and hearing their stories. Please pray for God to move their hearts to serve the outcasts of society in the future.

Ben and Kim serve with MTW in Kampala, Uganda.

Christ Our Refuge church (COR) recently held a Parenting Seminar. COR's goal for this seminar was twofold: to build up church members through a biblical understanding of parenting AND to welcome in neighbors/community members to expose them to this teaching and build relationships with them. It was the first community-wide event COR has hosted since the launch of our services back in December.

Ben and Kim were very encouraged to have about 50 adults and their children join them for this course. Most of the participants were from outside of COR's congregation, which was very exciting. It was led by Godfrey

and Olga Kyazze, a couple who are great friends, godly parents, and gifted teachers. They helped the participants see the way the love of God, experienced through faith in Jesus Christ, can transform marriages and the relationships between parents and children.

Some of the things that were taught/discussed at this conference:

- The order of importance of relationships (God being primary, followed by spouse, then children, then others) (e.g. Ephesians 5:22-33)
- The parents' role in conveying the love of God in Christ to their children (e.g. Ephesians 6:4)
- A framework for training children in Christ-like character (e.g. Proverbs 22:6)

Ben and Kim strongly feel led to spend another year in the field before returning home for HMA, for the following reasons:

- To provide COR's new church members with some pastoral stability, especially those who have just come to faith or are very young in the faith.
- To give time for our Ugandan assistant pastor, Ronald, to finish his pastoral training and ordination process, so he can be equipped to perform all the essential pastoral ministry components including administration of the Lord's Supper.
- To give us time to model for our team and the congregation healthy and biblical church practices such as congregational meetings, ministry planning, etc.
- Part of doing ministry in Uganda includes running a small NGO. While the NGO is small, the work to run it is not, and we are still working to get our organizational operations running well and would like to have it operating smoothly before returning to the U.S.

Ben and Kim need to raise a significant amount of support in order for them to spend this additional year in Uganda. Thus far, they have been able to raise 42% of this support increase in about 10 days, and they are now praying that funds will come in so that they will soon be able to reach this support goal.

- pray for those who attended the recent parenting conference, that they will be led to be Godly parents.
- pray for COR to be a Godly influence in the community.
- pray that Ben and Katie will soon raise the remainder of their needed support to extend their stay in Uganda.


This month we are highlighting the prayer requests from three chaplains who serve at our Military Service Academies.
